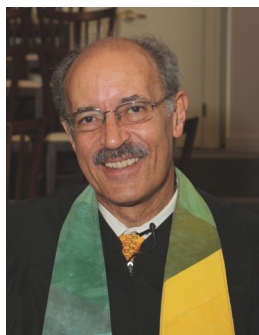

The *Creating Connections Auction* is a church-wide silent Event, Service and Vacation Home Auction being held on three **Sundays: May 5, 12 and 19.**

Bidding will take place at:

Margaret Fuller Hall from 10 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.

1. All proceeds go to the church's operating fund but are designated to help modernize our technical capabilities, including updating and adding AV carts, projectors and hearing assistive technology.
2. First Unitarian Members/Friends have generously volunteered to sponsor dinners, teas, expeditions, musical offerings, services, vacation home stays, wine events, game nights and other exciting opportunities.....all for our members, friends and their families in the coming year. We hope you will now participate and bid with equal generosity.
3. The catalog is now available on the church website, IN COLOR. Personal black and white copies are available at the auction table for a \$2 donation.
4. Register to receive your bid number on Sunday, Apr. 21 and 28, at the table in Fuller Hall or on Auction Days, May 5, 12 & 19.
5. There are two different categories in the Auction.
Item numbers 100s: Events, to which there can be multiple winners.
Item numbers 200s: Services, vacation homes and items.
6. After each service on May 5, 12 and 19, you may enter your bids on the bidding sheets in Margaret Fuller Hall. Remember, final bidding is on May 19 until 1:30pm.
7. Each line of our bid sheets are for just one person to attend, unless otherwise stated.
Make sure you write down your correct bid number on a separate line for every person you want to attend that event. If 2 people want to attend, write on 2 lines.
