

Highlights of the Past Year!

- Last year over 400 children and youth participated in our Learning Community.
 In our younger grades, we initiated a curriculum review with an eye toward anti-oppression and inclusion. In our YRUU, 15 youth embarked on a meaningful civil rights pilgrimage through the South.
- Last fall we welcomed dozens of asylees from Sheridan prison. This involved thousands of volunteer hours and was an embodied experience of working with our community partners toward the Beloved Community.

- Under Rev. Tom Disrud's leadership, First Connections classes have been launched to welcome newcomers and to help engage congregants and answer questions about our church operations.
- Speaking of Justice: Faith in Action E-Magazine was launched and has published seven issues focusing on the work of our social justice action programs and how working for justice is an expression of our UU spirituality.
- We contributed over \$57,000 last year—the largest amount ever—to other progressive groups from our Sunday plate collections.
