# FINDING COMMUNITY

First Unitarian is one of the largest Unitarian Universalist churches in the country. Attending the worship service on Sunday is a very special experience. Members who are looking for community and a way to deepen their commitment to the church find actively engaging in church programs and activities a very rewarding experience. We hope this engagement will allow you to start to feel apart of First Unitarian, and in turn that the folks here will become a community of friends.

This large church has an almost endless array of opportunities: numerous choral and hand bell choirs, social justice action groups, spirit circles, and special interest groups, which focus on such things as poetry, writing, etc., as well as a wide variety of *Good Times* events created just for fun and fellowship.

We encourage new members to actively seek out groups, programs, and activities that appeal to them and get involved as soon as possible. Contact information is listed for each group,

program, and activity in our **Making Connections Guide** and **Program Guide** (which we highly suggest you pick up at the Newcomer table or the Adult programs table in Fuller Hall or on our church website). Additionally, you can approach the volunteers standing behind the numerous activity or social justice action tables in Fuller Hall after each Sunday service. When you join the church, a member of our Membership Committee will contact you and offer assistance in helping you make the connections you seek in our church community.

The church also needs and welcomes volunteers. Volunteers help in the office during the week, support Sunday services by ushering, greeting at the Welcome Desk, serving coffee, hosting the Newcomer Table, staffing our Beacon Bookstore, and serving on numerous church committees and on our Board of Trustees. Teachers are also needed for children or adults through our Religious Education programs.

A brief Enrollment Ceremony is held between services on the first Sunday of every month at 10:30 a.m. in the Eliot Center's Channing Room (A101), or as otherwise announced in the Sunday Order of Service. During the summer months, the Enrollment Ceremony is held at 11:15 a.m.

During the Ceremony, you will sign the Membership Record Book and have a chance to meet other new members. We'll also take a

group photo to post on our website and share important information about membership. Although no preparatory classes are required for membership, we encourage you to take the **Path to Engagement class**, particularly if the Unitarian Universalist faith is new to you.

We look forward to welcoming you as a member into our community at First Unitarian Church.

# Your Pledge is Part of Your Commitment and Helps Sustain the Work of the First Unitarian Church

Each autumn, as part of our Annual Fund Drive (AFD), First Unitarian asks its members and friends to make a pledge of financial support for the coming calendar year. A pledge is a promise to donate a certain amount of money to the church during the calendar year. It is a statement of intent; it's not a legally binding obligation.

Our annual budget is about \$2.3 million, which "keeps the lights on" for our block-sized downtown campus, supports our staff and pays for the rich array of programs we offer. Pledges and contributions account for the largest percentage of our operating budget, almost 70%, This means that each and every pledge plays a decisive role in the ability of First Unitarian to work towards fulfilling its mission each year. WE really are the church.

Our policies ask that members pledge "generously within their means." We each are asked to reflect on what that amount might be. One person described this as "Give until it feels good."
