The emerging church

ET observations:

- We know little about the church that will emerge from the pandemic:
 - How large will the post-pandemic First Unitarian include? (in-person and virtual)

the balance becomes more important than the numbers

- The demographic makeup may have shifted and it will shape the ministry of the post-pandemic church
- Virtual participation how to ask for the sharing of financial abundance why is the initial virtual participation not sustained
- Return to in-person is not indicative, safety concerns may be indicative from now on
- There may be a dramatic shift to virtual ministry
- The assumption among larger UU churches is that they will be smaller and the budgets will be also
- More collaboration among congregations including sharing staff
- The second question is about money
 - The shortfall we experienced in our Annual Fund Drive is a great result these days
 - Current Annual Fund Drive has 750 pledge units, down 7.5% from last year
 - Last year and two years prior were around 820 pledge units
 - Average pledged increased 3.3%
 - In the pandemic, some congregants have drifted away
 - 8th principle and changes in music may have also changed participation
 - How many who drifted will return?
 - Most UU congregations fundraise in the spring
- O How much physical space will post-pandemic First Unitarian require?
 - Probably less
 - When the building might be used has changed
- O How large will a right-sized staff be?
 - Staffing needs to follow the need of the ministry
 - Ministry tends to follow staffing resources
 - How to determine where to do deficient spending (ie, a full-time communications person for outreach to younger people)?
- o What analysis and investigation can be done now and which have to wait?
 - To which things are the new senior minister central?

Questions and observations that were surfaced:

- What is the future of NW Academy in our building?
- There may be a need for a hybrid type church in the future
- This is one of a number of pandemics
- How can we attract the type of membership we would like?
- How might we work with other UU churches?
- How to live with uncertainty
- If we build they will come maybe not for the emerging church

Bill's Notes for the Board Generative Conversation 1/6/2022

The Emerging Church: What Are the Questions? How Much Do We Know Now?

We know very little with certainty about the shape/size/needs of the church that will emerge from the pandemic.

The open questions are substantial, with substantial ramifications.

1. How large will the post-pandemic First Unitarian be?

Total membership/attendance/participation important

Balance of in-person vs virtual participation almost more important.

Balance of age groups, racial-cultural-sexual-gender identities, parents v non-parents will be shaped or will shape First Unitarian ministry.

Difficulty monetizing virtual participation needs attention.

Extraordinary virtual participation of spring 2020 (900+ devices/Sunday) not sustained. Fatigue at church-on-a-screen?

Brief return to in-person worship not predictive. Pandemic anxieties and safety concerns still too present. Those concerns, at reduced levels, however, may well become the norm.

If the return to in-person is predictive, at all, the balance between in-person and virtual will shift dramatically to the virtual. Far too early to tell.

Assumption among other large UU congregations is that our congregations will be smaller, at least for a time. Assumption is that budgets will also be reduced, at least for a time. Retirements of ministers increased. Also ministers leaving ministry. Explorations of staff, programmatic sharing (DC area). All Souls/First Unitarian SJ collaboration.

2. How much financial support will the congregation provide?

Current AFD is only hard data. Close to complete.

Approx 5% Shortfall from Goal (Before major donor gift)

Given 2 years of pandemic church life, we view that result as extremely hopeful.

760 pledge units, down 7.5% (vs 820 in 2021; 822 in 2020; 821 in 2019) All as of January 4. Stability of last three years suggests 2022 decrease is pandemic related.

Average Pledge increase +3.3% (+8.4% in 2021, +1.6% in 2019

Tentative conclusion: Some individuals and families (esp) have "drifted away," most from outer circles of involvement, where pledges tend to be lower. Focus on race and changes in music program have had an impact as well.

How many will return (or be replaced by other outer circle folx or even folx for whom the church is central) once return to in-person is well established? Visitors Christmas Eve encouraging...perhaps.

Most UU congregations do annual fundraising in the spring. There will be more information from other large congregations by year end.

3. How much physical space will post-pandemic First Unitarian require?

Answer unclear. Probably less...but how much less?

Given changes in downtown, how much building use will there be on other than weekend daylight hours?

4. How large will a "right-sized" staff be to support the post-pandemic First Unitarian?

At least tentative answers too many questions above needed to begin answering this one.

NB: the staff resources and ministry focus of the church both follow size/money, they also can lead. The success of the large church is dependent on staff and what staff do. Outreach and public presence can grow the church, witness the growth during the early Sewell ministry.

The shape of the church's ministry makes a huge difference and is within the control of the congregation/leadership. EG: First Unitarian could employ a full time Communications Staff Person with specific goal of outreach to younger constituency. Would the church "deficit" spend in the service of mission?

- 5. What other questions should we be asking?
- 6. What analysis or investigations can be done now??? Which must or should wait for a new Senior Minister to arrive and settle into leadership?

Will the new Senior lead this exploration or join an exploration already in process?

M/S/C approval of November minutes

Consent agenda item: Kern Thompson report fiscal year ending June 30 2021 (Accounting Advisory subcommittee)

We want solid information going into an audit year. Kathryn recommends approval. Approval concurred by AA subcommittee. M/S/C: Sent to the Board for final approval.

Consent agenda item: Sewell Lecture (Kathryn, Ed)

Proposal is to memorialize the understanding about the relationship between the Foundation and the ET as a Policy for the Church. No effective changes to the relationship itself are proposed. Suggested wording to clarify that all Sewell designated funds belong to the Church and not the Foundation. Tabled, will be addressed again when Ed can do a revised draft of the document.

Outside In update (Kathryn)

Outside In lease renews in 2022. Previous leases included an automatic year to year 3% cost of living increase in rents. Do we continue increases this year, or do we stand pat? Kathryn to contact a congregant with commercial real estate expertise for a 2022 downtown rental market update. Noted that Outside In's rents are much lower for the free-standing house versus the syringe exchange office. Suggestion from the committee of perhaps bringing up the rate on the house over time while holding a rate on the exchange office? Kathryn to update in a future meeting.

ET update (Kathryn)

Seminary for a Day registration is now closed with 180 online participants (!). Will use new

broadcast tech which should increase quality. Meanwhile, the Foundation gift for next year will be 5% of its trailing 13 quarter asset balance (==\$82K), up from \$73K this year.

A matching gift will be provided by a generous donor to double any new pledges for this year's fund drive. There will also be a gentle reminder to the congregation that the cutoff for being a pledging member and voting for the new minister is April 3rd.

Zaida to retire in July after being here since 2001. ET, Pat Malone, Leila, Linda and Jo Ann have been consulting how to staff finance, administration, and stewardship functions as we go forward.

Public Health team meets on Thursday 1/27. Will follow their guidance on re-opening in person.

Request for someone who is good with spreadsheets to analyze the Church's energy usage patterns over time given variables such as in-person versus remote operations, lighting upgrades, new solar panels, & etc. Alan volunteered to look at the numbers. If there are other volunteers, please contact Kathryn directly. Q. Given how unusual the Covid years have been, can we glean anything meaningful from this usage data? A. To be seen.

A large and very generous one-time gift was received in December. Q. do we know if new post-Covid congregants are pledging? A. Work in progress.
